Depression is a widespread condition affecting approximately 7.5 million parents in the U.S. each year and may be putting at least 15 million children at risk for adverse health outcomes.

Raymond's son Richard ran the family-owned Purdue. The template Arthur Sackler created to sell Valium—co-opting

doctors, influencing the FDA, downplaying the drug's addictiveness—was employed to launch a far more potent

product: OxyContin. The drug went on to generate some thirty-five billion dollars in revenue, and to launch a public

health crisis in which hundreds of thousands would die. This is the saga of three generations of a single family and the

mark they would leave on the world, a tale that moves from the bustling streets of early twentieth-century Brooklyn to the

seaside palaces of Greenwich, Connecticut, and Cap d'Antibes to the corridors of power in Washington, D.C. Empire of Pain chronicles the multiple investigations of the Sacklers and their company, and the scorched-earth legal tactics that the family has used to evade accountability. Europe and Asia; some had lost their fathers to death, others to divorce or abandonment. Each account was unique, but the impact of a father's loss was profound in every woman's life. Thomas begins by defining what it means to be a father in our world. She discusses the initial shock of his loss, exploring the aspects that color how a young girl experiences it: her age at the time of her father's death or abandonment, her mother's behavior and attitudes, her place in the family vis-à-vis siblings, and the influence of a stepfather or father-surrogates. Thomas shows how a father's early death or abandonment affects a woman's emotional health and self-esteem, her body image, her sexual experiences, her marriage, her family life, and her career. Perhaps most important, Thomas offers compassionate advice for coming to terms with father loss, even late in life, from actively mourning, to healing, to starting fresh.
