A deep vibration shook the entire island. Jets of steam and ash emanated from the summit, followed by an explosion louder than any sound heard by Homo sapiens since our species evolved on Earth. The eruption of the Toba supervolcano released the energy of a million tons of explosives; seven hundred cubic miles of magma spewed outward in an explosion forty times larger than the largest hydrogen bomb and more than a thousand times as powerful as the Krakatau eruption in 1883. So much ash and debris was injected into the stratosphere that it partially blocked the sun's radiation and caused global temperatures to drop by five to nine

degrees. It took a full decade for Earth to recover to its pre-eruption temperatures. When Humans Nearly Vanished presents the controversial argument that the Toba catastrophe nearly wiped out the human race, leaving only about a thousand to ten thousand breeding pairs of humans worldwide. Human genes today show evidence of a "genetic bottleneck," an effect seen when a population of organisms becomes so small that their genetic diversity is greatly reduced. This group of survivors could be the ancestors of all humans alive today. Donald R. Treasure Island is an adventure novel by Scottish author Robert Louis Stevenson, narrating a tale of "buccaneers and buried gold". First published as a book on May 23, 1883, it was originally serialized in the children's magazine *Young Folks* between 1881-82 under the title *Treasure Island or, the mutiny of the Hispaniola* with Stevenson adopting the pseudonym Captain George North. Traditionally considered a coming-of-age story, *Treasure Island* is an adventure tale known for its atmosphere, characters and action, and also as a wry commentary on the ambiguity of morality – as seen in *Long John Silver* – unusual for children's literature now and then. It is one of the most frequently dramatized of all novels. The influence of *Treasure Island* on popular perceptions of pirates is enormous, including treasure maps marked with an "X", schooners, the Black Spot, tropical islands, and one-legged seamen carrying parrots on their shoulders. The *Mysterious Island* (French: *L'Île mystérieuse*) is a novel by Jules Verne, published in 1874. The novel is a crossover sequel to Verne's famous *Twenty Thousand Leagues Under the Sea* and *In Search of the Castaways*, though thematically it is vastly different from those books. An early draft of the novel, initially rejected by Verne's publisher and wholly reconceived before publication, was titled *Shipwrecked Family: Marooned With Uncle Robinson*, seen as indicating the influence on the novel of *Robinson Crusoe* and *The Swiss Family Robinson*. The book tells the adventures of five American prisoners of war on an uncharted island in the South Pacific. Beginning in the American Civil War, as famine and death ravage the city of Richmond, Virginia, five northern POWs decide to escape in a rather unusual way – by hijacking a balloon!
